

GIRL'S CROSS-COUNTRY

BACK-TO-BACK STATE CHAMPIONS



The girls cross country team won their second consecutive state title this fall. They won nine invitationals and finished the season undefeated with a 203-0 record. They won their 11th Cascade Conference title and second straight Regional title. The girls had six all-state runners and have won 76 consecutive Cascade Conference regular season dual meets. Lindsey Burdette, Megan Hubbard, Emily Wrozek, Sharon Morgan, Kelly Morgan, Shannon Richardson and Sierra Melling all competed at the state meet at MIS. Lindsey Burdette was named Jackson Citizen Patriot Runner of the Year, regional and conference champion three consecutive years, captain, in-

dividual state runner up, all-state three years and school record holder with a time of 17:54. Megan Hubbard was two time all-state, academic all-state. and all-conference, all-regional Dream Team for two consecutive years. Emily Wrozek was two time all-state, four time all-conference. Cascade Confer-

ence champion once, three time allregional, four time all-area and team captain twice. Sharon Morgan was two time all-state and four time all-conference, allregional and all-area. Kelly Morgan was all-state once, all-area and four time allconference and all-regional. Shannon Richardson was all-area, all-conference and all-regional. Sierra Melling was twice all-conference and all-area. Chara Sykes was named MVP due to her captain's ability. Six of this year's runners rank in the top seven for Hanover-Horton cross country history. It was an outstanding year for the girls and they earned every bit of their success.

of the unit, their task is to decrease the speed of a marble rolling down an inclined plane. Knowledge of friction and balanced and unbalanced forces must be used to achieve a decrease in time. Next, they will be using the data to calculate acceleration and speed.

On Friday, November 5, the fifth grade celebrated a Native American Potlatch, which is a special ceremony where gifts are given, games are played, and a huge feast is eaten. Students participated in Native games, made masks, carved animals from soap bars, made



their own butter for the cooking demonstration and painted Native American signs on sheets which were later used to build teepees. A special visitor, Gray Wolf, told about his life as a medicine man of the Great Plains Tribes. Students made Indian cakes on an open fire with Mrs. Reed, who demonstrated pioneer life on a wagon train. At

the end of the potlatch, teepees were built and gifts made by the students were traded. Thanks to all who helped make the potlatch a memorable event.
